


be part of August. And get this Twin Fans, you might see me at Target Field a few times!!!!!

Help us bring hope this Christmas

This September we are asking all members, regular attenders, and guests to assemble a Shoe Box for Christmas at Spirit Lake Nation in North Dakota and Red Lake Reservation here in Minnesota.

What is in a Shoebox?

Love Shoebox Christmas gifts are built from love for children that might not otherwise get a Christmas gift. On the reservation, up to 70 percent of the children would not get a Christmas gift if not for the Shoebox Christmas Gift program and the generosity of the people that donate to this wonderful program. To start, wrap the bottom and top of the box separately (this will allow us to insert the story of the birth of Jesus. If you have children, grandchildren, nieces or nephews, ask them what they would like for Christmas. Add that, a few more small gifts, some candy, a winter hat, mittens or gloves, place a rubber band around the box and the top, then put the age group and gender of the child on top of the box. You have just built a box of love. We are looking for the following age groups. Infant, Toddler, 3-5, 6-8, 9-12, 13 and up. Please only add new toys and please don't put any clothing except the hats/gloves or mittens in the boxes. Then bring them to BUMC by Sunday Sept. 29th. After worship on the 29th as one of our service projects that day, we are going to add the Christmas Story to them and get them ready for delivery as one of our projects that day.

What would happen if every household of BUMC was able to put at least one shoe box together? We would call that a miracle! It's possible, as all things are possible with God!


Reckless Love: Jesus Call to Love our Neighbor A Book and Bible Study Starting in September



Greetings from the Brooklyn Recovery Ministry, a new ministry of Brooklyn United Methodist Church! For those of you who I have yet to meet, my name is Pastor Howie Baird, and I am a person in recovery. What that means is that I haven't felt the need to use alcohol, drugs, or other substances to alter my mental state since March 3, 2018. Actually, recovery is so much more than just not using. I always say anyone can stop using, but recovery is harder. Recovery means learning to live a self-directed life where one's health and wellness is greatly improved all while striving to



The first step in almost any program of recovery is admitting that we have a problem and that we need help. In Alcoholics Anonymous step one states, "We admitted we were powerless over alcohol—that our lives had become unmanageable." I believe that if when you wake up in the morning and you aren't excited about what's ahead, or you lay your head down at night and you can't think of anything you are grateful for that day, then your life is unmanageable. After all, whether we believe it comes through work, or family, or church, or finances, what we are all trying to manage in our lives is joy.

One of the first things I had to do to find recovery was to let go of trying so hard to manage my joy. Instead, I had to refocus all of the time and energy I spent on that pursuit towards God. It was then that I finally found joy in my life. When Christ came into this world, he said that he came to set us free. I believe his desire is that we would have joy in our lives, and along with that joy - love, peace, and hope. He taught what many folks in recovery have learned: that the journey towards a better life begins by giving our lives up to God. When we do that, as it says in 2 Corinthians, we become a new creation.

My hope and prayer for the Brooklyn Recovery Ministry is that many in our community who are struggling with addiction would come and see that recovery is possible in their lives, that God loves them deeply and desires to set them free from their addictions. And that by letting go and letting God, they can find the joy they have been yearning for in their lives. That being said, this ministry is not just about those in recovery, it is about all of us. When we allow God to be in charge of our every day, God can do incredible things in and through us. I pray that each one of us this coming month would spend time daily connecting deeper to our amazing God. I also ask that we would all pray for the Brooklyn Recovery Ministry. God is going to use this ministry not only to make a new thing happen in the lives of those who come into our community, but in our lives as well. This is what I believe it means to be the heart of the Brooklyns; that we are pumping in and pumping out the love of God to the community around us.

Recovery Ministry starts August 18.




