noon and 6:30pm (starting Sept. 4th) as well as Sundays at 10am (starting Sunday, Sept. 1st) and Facebook live postings about our themes at 6:30pm every Sunday. Download the book with your e-reader, order one from your favorite book seller or pick one up from the church office (\$13) if you would like to be part of the Book Study.



Brooklyn United Methodist Church has entered into a Minnesota Annual Conference Program called MCCI (Missional Church Consultation Initiative.) Our Annual Conference Leadership and Bishop Ough invited us to become part of this initiative to help BUMC into a new lifecycle of fruitfulness. The MCCI brochures can be found at the Welcome Desk.

About once a month Pastor Rich will be attending an all day Pastor Cohort and learn some new skills to help us grow to be more fruitful as a church (he will receive over 80 hours of training over the year.) At the end of the process the entire church will vote on some unique prescriptions for BUMC and be assigned a coach for each prescription we decide to put into action. Look at this spot in our newsletter each month for updates on the process.

MCCI processes will all start this month with the introduction of what we call the Breakthrough Prayer Initiative. A copy of the Breakthrough Prayer is included in this newsletter and we are asking all to pray this prayer at 7:20am and 7:20pm everyday. The MCCI process all starts in prayer. teaching us as a church to not snack on prayer but feast on it.

Help us bring hope this Christmas

This September we are asking all members, regular attenders, and guests to assemble a Shoe Box for Christmas at Spirit Lake Nation in North Dakota and Red Lake Reservation here in Minnesota.

What is in a Shoebox?

Love Shoebox Christmas gifts are built from love for children that might not otherwise get a Christmas gift. On the reservation, up to 70 percent of the children would not get a Christmas gift if not for the Shoebox Christmas Gift program and the generosity of the people that donate to this wonderful program. To start, wrap the bottom and top of the box separately (this will allow us to insert the story of the birth of Jesus. If you have children, grandchildren, nieces or nephews, ask them what they would like for Christmas. Add that, a few more small gifts, some candy, a winter hat, mittens or gloves, place a rubber band around the box and the top, then put the age group and gender of the child on top of the box. You have just built a box of love. We are looking for the following age groups. Infant, Toddler, 3-5, 6-8, 9-12, 13 and up. Please only add new toys and please don't put any clothing except the hats/gloves or mittens in the boxes. Then bring them to BUMC by Sunday Sept. 29th. After worship on the 29th as one of our service projects that day, we are going to add the Christmas Story to them and get them ready for delivery as one of our projects that day.

What would happen if every household of BUMC was able to put at least one shoe box together? We would call that a miracle! It's possible, as all things are possible with God!

Our Recovery Ministry has had its test runs and we are ready for you and the community to join us every Sunday evening in the Fellowship Hall at 5:30pm. Recovery meetings will start after the service.



As you might remember from last month's article, recovery is so much more than just not using. I always say anyone can stop using, but recovery is harder. Recovery means learning to live a self-directed life where one's health and wellness is greatly improved all while striving to reach one's full potential in life. In other words, recovery is not just quitting something, it's starting something new.

The first step in almost any program of recovery is admitting that we have a problem and that we need help. In Alcoholics Anonymous step one states, "We admitted we were powerless over alcohol—that our lives had become unmanageable." I believe that if when you wake up in the morning and you aren't excited about what's ahead, or you lay your head down at night and you can't think of anything you are grateful for that day, then your life is unmanageable. After all, whether we believe it comes through work, or family, or church, or finances, what we are all trying to manage in our lives is joy.

My hope and prayer for the Brooklyn Recovery Ministry is that many in our community who are struggling with addiction would come and see that recovery is possible in their lives, that God loves them deeply and desires to set them free from their addictions. And that by letting go and letting God, they can find the joy they have been yearning for in their lives. That being said, this ministry is not just about those in recovery, it is about all of us. When we allow God to be in charge of our every day. God can do incredible things in and through us. I pray that each one of us this coming month would spend time daily connecting deeper to our amazing God. I also ask that we would all pray for the Brooklyn Recovery Ministry. God is going to use this ministry not only to make a new thing happen in the lives of those who come into our community, but in our lives as well. This is what I believe it means to be the heart of the Brooklyns; that we are pumping in and pumping out the love of God to the community around us.

history. In total, over
the last 30 years the
MEGA SALE has brought
in \$531,414!!!! Yes
some expenses came

out of that total over the years, and we do not have records for a few years, but that is an impressive total. The best year on record, 2015 with a total income of \$47,170. It seems the lowest total was \$3680 in 2004. We averaged \$24,155 over the last 22 years we had a sale or have records of income from the sale. Our last MEGA sale brought in \$26,456. In the early years BUMY (our youth group) sponsored the sale and the proceeds supported youth activities and their budget.

An endeavor worth the work! It built community, it helped the community, it reached out in mission, and it helped our church budget. Thanks to the youth and their leadership who got it all started 30 years ago. Thanks to all who lead and served. Now as it has come to a close, what is next? What "MEGA" event could be next for us? What ideas do you have? Let's start talking to each other about ideas.


