

Harvest in my tradition has always been the time when the church turns to stewardship, and asking us all to help the church be stewards of our resources as we turn to planning ministry, and funding our ministry for 2020. There is so much happening that I think we sometimes forget all that BUMC does to be the heart of the Brooklyns.

Our beloved United Methodist Church is in global turmoil as we struggle with issues around human sexuality. The hard truth about our Church is we are still struggling with the issues of race. Our national, and international politics, are in chaos and nationalism is on the rise throughout the globe. There are too many people struggling with addiction, poverty, child care, how the paycheck does not last as long as the bills pile, and do not get me started on the cost of insulin in this country (and I have great insurance!). We even witnessed national, state and local officials attack an autistic young lady for standing up for climate change.

But in the midst of all of this, BUMC is the heart of the Brooklyns by loving God and neighbor, by healing a broken world and by reaching new people. As we enter November, just read through this newsletter and you will see a church loving its God and its neighbor. And despite all that is happening around us, we follow Christ out into God's world and we are making a difference at BUMC. That is why we are asking in November to help us plan our ministry and mission into 2020, how we'll be stewards of God.

My advice on our stewardship comes straight from John Wesley, the founder of the Methodist Movement: Earn all you cam, save all you can, so that you can give all you can.

HOMELESS YOUTH ADVOCACY

Pastor Rich would like to form a team, a Wesley Small Group, around the issues of Youth Homelessness in the Brooklyns (the Northwest Metro). Would you want to be part of this small group? 8 people who would gather monthly for study, discipleship, care of our own souls, as well as a group who would then help educate us on the issues of Youth Homelessness in our "backyard." We would also advocate for two organizations in our community — Avenues for Homeless Youth and Hope4Youth. We would help promote our Change4Change offerings for these organizations, set up service opportunities for BUMC at Avenues and Hope4Youth, as well as drives for in-kind donations. In effect this will be a small group with a purpose of putting our faith into action by loving God, loving our neighbors, and healing a broken world around the issue of youth homelessness. Who knows, we may even reach new people! If you want to join the group, let the office know. We will begin our group in January.



MCCI UPDATE (Missional Church Consultation Initiative)

I have met with my Pastor Cohort, a group of local UM clergy

all leading their churches through the MCCI process, now twice with the third being on Oct. 31st. At the close of October I will have trained our executive leadership team on a major project of MCCI, a few months of work discovering our history of ministry and writing a narrative of our past mission and ministry. At the same time I will be doing a demographic study of a 5 mile radius around BUMC and North UMC. This work by our executive leadership will take some time. Once they have completed their work, I will get the information, as well as my demographic work, out to us all. This task is going to take some time though. Maybe we will be able to leak some of what we are learning as we go.

On Sunday, the 27th of October, 10am, I will be leading a small group, 3 or 4 people in reviewing all our communications to evaluate if we as a church just provide information or do we build a sense of anticipation. With all the information that we get in today's world, people no longer respond to just information, they need a sense of anticipation to engage them in ministry. It will be interesting to see what this group discovers about BUMC's communication. I'll get their findings out to you in next month's newsletter.

Also, if you are a sociologist at heart, talk with Pastor Rich about looking over the data he has about our communities. He would love some help looking it over.

As part of the MCCI process we are exploring a partnership in ministry with North UMC. With this, I will be preaching at North UMC every 4th Sunday (they worship at 10:30am) and then lead their Church Council in the MCCI process. Anyone willing to join me on the 4th Sundays at North UMC? I would love to have a few people come over after the 9am service and help fill a pew or two at North Musicians - would also love some special music to go with me!

UMCOR responds to natural or civil disasters of such magnitude that they overwhelm a community's ability to recover on its own. Through UMCOR, United Methodists extend loving care to people within the United States. When disaster strikes, it is local churches that provide the first response to their communities. This basic understanding—that disaster response is local—forms the foundation for UMCOR's US disaster training and response. When responding to a disaster in the United States, UMCOR provides training, financial assistance, expertise, community collaboration to churches and partners making them more resilient to disasters.

UM STUDENT DAY/GARRETT EVANGELICAL THEOLOGICAL SCHOLARSHIP - 11/17 & 11/24

Across the country, the people of The United Methodist Church are serving the people God loves in Jesus' name. We're doing it at home, but so often we'd like to do more.

- We want to serve those in other places who are suffering.
- We want to offer spiritual words of hope and life.
- And we want to be well-equipped to do both!
 But the reality for most of us is that our
 responsibilities—home, family, work—don't
 allow us to engage with every need we'd like to
 meet.

Right now there are UMC young people—who might not have had the resources to attend a school of their choice, or, for some, any school at all—who've been sent by you into the world God loves because of your giving to United Methodist Student Day. When you give generously you are supporting these students as they prepare for a life that unites faith with knowledge.

We'll also be supporting the scholarship in Pastor Rich's name at his theological alma mater.



Stewardship

We view stewardship as your individual and family's faith journey to prayerfully consider how God has gifted you with your time, talents and treasures and explore in prayer what you feel that God is asking you to give to our church.

This time of the year, pastors and finance committees are

scrambling to put together a financial or stewardship piece. After all:

- we are behind budget
- the summer slump hit us hard
- unless people step up

For some churches, the first course of action is to have the chair of finance stand before the congregation loaded with pie charts and spreadsheets to **grimly inform the congregation of the impending financial crisis**. Maybe ten year old Henry is paraded up front and asked the question, "Do we really want to cut a staff position?" And of course, the people in the pews begin to tune out and think, "Here we go again."

There is a better way...l promise!

What if stewardship and giving had less to do with budgets, buildings, dollars and cents?

What if stewardship and giving were a way to help people live life to the fullest?

What if stewardship was about learning to embrace ourselves as children of God created in the very image of God?

In his book, *Generosity Rising*, Scott McKenzie re-writes the opening to the Declaration of Independence as: *We hold these truths to be self-evident, that all people are created in the image of a loving, giving, and generous God. We believe real life, true liberty and eternal joy are only realized when we live lives with abundant generosity and sacrificial love.*

Generosity begins with God.

McKenzie had seen many finance chairs and pastors shake their head at this, suggesting that what is theologically true and what is practically true are somehow not related.

They may say, "But we have to talk budget, we have to let people know how far behind we are or they won't give." To this sentiment, I ask... how has that been working for you?

The *most important* stewardship verse in the Bible has nothing to do with budgets, building, dollars and cents. The most important stewardship verse is this: For God so loved the world that he gave his only Son, so that everyone who believes in him may not perish but have eternal life. – John 3:16 (NRSV)

God loves...God gives...And the world is forever changed!

We are created to love and to give.

We are created in the image of God. We are created to love and to give. When we love and when we give, we become the people God created us to be. We are forever changed and the world is forever changed. Now that we'll preach!

Yes, we are almost at the end of October. Yes, we are behind in giving. Take a deep breath, we've been here before. Always God has made a way. So folks, we have the opportunity to become the loving, generous people God created us to be. Let's change the world through our love and giving.

For God so loved the world He gave...

This November, you are invited to participate in our Annual Stewardship drive. We want to create a culture of generosity at BUMC. Scott McKenzie's book "Generosity Rising" will guide our conversations. The theme is "Stewardship is grounded in Gratitude, revealed in Prayer, and lived in Faith." Four Sundays we will reflect on the following:

November 3 Gratitude

November 10 Prayer as willingness

November 17 Faith

November 24 Commitment

Also join me for a 21-day devotional challenge offered by Scott McKenzie starting November 3. Details to follow.

Not forgetting, we have an energized and farsighted Stewardship team to steer us throughout next year in achieving our goal for stewardship and generosity. This team will work with finance, staff, and leadership to create the culture.

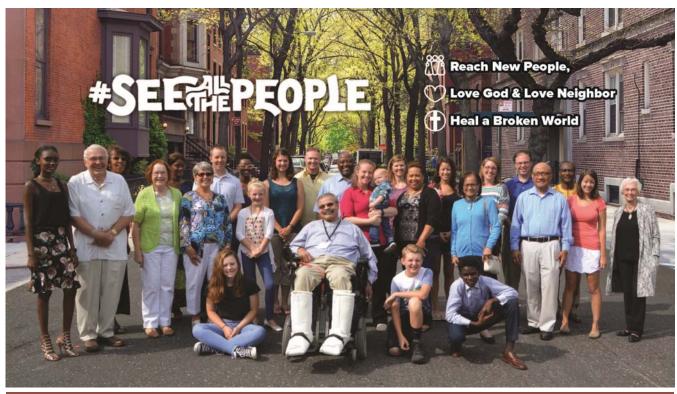
