
Living out the 2 great commandments of Jesus Christ in everything we do as a community of faith.

HEAL A BROKEN WORLD

Serving alongside our neighbors to become the heart of the Brooklyns, the north side and beyond.

We are pumping in and pumping out the love of God to the community around us.

In September we began a worship and sermon series we are calling Reckless Love. It is based on a book by author and United Methodist pastor Tom Berlin called *Reckless Love: Jesus' call to love our neighbor*. In the last few weeks we have listened to the call of Christ to BE LOVE, we have asked all of us to start every day and every encounter we have with a neighbor by saying the words, to ourselves "Begin with Love." Thinking that if we can begin with love,



every encounter we have will help us to love our neighbor. Then we asked if we could each expand our circle. Every person can know about 160 people. Sure some of our circles are pretty tight and have our "inner circle" of family and friends, then maybe a little less tight circle of family, friends, co-workers and the circles expand. But all together about 160 in our circles. The question from Christ, can we expand who we include? Can we ask some neighbors in who are different from ourselves? Then we asked if we could start to lavish love, share God's constant love, by first observing our own soul, then giving some thanks, then reaching out with lavish love to our neighbors in very practical ways. We have gotten a pretty good start on BE LOVE. So now in October we are going to finish it out by talking about the O-V-E of BE LOVE.

Our themes for October - Openhearted Love, Value the Vulnerable, and Emulate Christ. Bishop Ough, the Bishop of the Minnesota-Dakotas Annual Conferences will come and share on the 13th of October (all 3 services) his dream for the Annual Conference on how we can all love boldly. Join us every Sunday in worship this October as we Reckless Love our neighbors.

It is not too late to join pastor Rich and small groups studying Reckless Love. We have study group meetings Sunday mornings at 10am, Wednesdays at Noon and 6:30pm. And if you can't make a study, pick up in your inbox or on paper at church a copy of what I call Grab Gather Grow. It is a weekly study based on our Scripture and theme each Sunday. Grab it, Go gather a small group of any kind and use it to Grow your faith.

Join the Heart of the Brooklyns in some Reckless Love this October.

Brooklyn United Methodist Church, at the invitation of the Bishop and his cabinet, and the approval our Church Council, have entered into the MCCI Process: Missional Church Consultation Initiative. It is a process for developing a

plan and implementing that plan for church renewal, with the guidance of the director of the program, Sue Nilson Kibbey. She also leads a pastoral cohort, which I am a part of, and once our plan is in place we will learn from nationwide coaches to help our implementation. Our cohort of Minnesota and Dakota Clergy meets once a month to learn and grow in leadership and then each month I will bring back, to both Brooklyn UMC and North UMC, my monthly assignments which always include teaching our Church Council and Staff what I have learned so they can help implement the MCCI process.

I have had two cohort meetings to date. And I have been teaching our council and staff what I have learned as well as getting them involved in the implementation of the MCCI process. I have given them an assessment of our leadership style, which by the way I will be taking it to many leadership teams but if you would like to take it, stop by the office during the week or on Sunday at our Welcome Center for a copy.

I have some teaching around what type of church mindset we have at BUMC, are we a fixed mindset or a growth mindset? What do you think? Our Council thinks maybe we are leaning toward a fixed mindset in our current place. Agree? My major learning from this is that a Church will follow its pastor's mindset. So I am learning how sometimes I may have a fixed mindset and how I can break out of that thinking. The word we are learning about is how "coachable" am I as a pastor, and how coachable our leadership can be to help lead our church into a growth mindset. For me I need to remind myself of the five practices of a Coachable Leader:

- 1) Keep yourself hungry in order to exceed beyond your wildest imagination
- 2) Be willing and open to be taught from whomever God sends
- 3) Assimilate feedback, not discount, defend or make feedback into criticism
- 4) Embrace who you are, and your calling
- 5) Courage to go out of your comfort zone and do things differently

But the biggest and frankly the most important thing we have done since starting the MCCI process is begin our Breakthrough Prayer. I hope you have joined us at 7:20am and 7:20 pm in praying our Breakthrough prayer. We are asking God to breakthrough into our lives, into the life of BUMC. We are going to not snack on prayer as part of the MCCI process but feast on it. We do want every person praying it twice a day every day. We ask every team, committee, circle, group, gathering, practice, service team, every single group to open up every single gathering with the Breakthrough Prayer. So as you read this update let's pray it...

God of grace, breakthrough Brooklyn UMC with your Spirit.
Show us how to be the Heart of the Brooklyns.
Show us how to love You and Neighbor.
Show us how to heal a broken world.
Show us how to reach new people.
Show us how to be a church for everyone.
And give us the grace and courage to act on your will. Amen.

Each month I will have a little update for you on the MCCI process so watch this space. We have just begun!






