REOPENING THE CHURCH

The question everyone is asking is, "When will BUMC reopen?" The answer to that question is simple—we have never closed! Sure the Pandemic has forced us to shut down worship in the facility, along with meetings, fellowship and Sunday School. And yes, the staff is all working from home ... but the truth is we have never shut down and worship attendance seems to be holding its own. We have just shifted our focus to where it should always be. The church is not a building, it is the people, and so many have been doing so much during this Pandemic. From our West African Food Pantry to Loaves and Fishes, from neighbors reaching out to neighbors, to joining in the protests and protecting neighborhoods, to a prayer vigil at 38th and Chicago ... BUMC has never shut down!

But <u>we hope</u> to return to worship in our facility on **Sunday, Sept. 6th**. For that to happen we have a lot of procedures to put into place, some input from you, and the Pandemic Curve begins to flatten. The

following are what we need to do and what we need from you to "Re-Open" for worship.

1) Our Pastors, Trustee Committee, and Church Leadership are working on some protocols we have to have in place before Sept. 6th and report them back to the State of Minnesota before Sept 6th. These protocols deal with how we will worship and how we will clean and sanitize the facility between each service, as well as how many people will be allowed inside at one time keeping strict social distancing. We hope that we can have up to 150 people, which is 50% occupancy, which the State allows, but with 6 feet of social distance. We have a lot of work to do before the 6th.

2) We need you to take a survey for us and return it by either the mail or take the online survey which should already be in your email inbox. I can not stress enough how important this survey is to take and return to us ASAP so we can do the planning needed for us to worship again inside (and if you have not given to BLMC in public plans include your title or effection when you return the survey)

given to BUMC in awhile please include your tithe or offering when you return the survey.)

3) Remember on **Sept. 6th** our hope is to open up BUMC for worship on Sundays. We are starting to re-open BUMC with a worship first policy. We will still have our staff work from home, we will hold no meetings, fellowship groups or Sunday School until we know it is safe to do so. Worship First, and hopefully the rest will come.

4) Worship starting Sept. 6th will be only a half-hour long, no singing, no hymnals or Bibles, face masks must be worn by all worshipers as well as strict social distancing protocols will be followed. Hand sanitizer stations, temperature checks, and recording of attendance for tracking in case of exposure from Covid-19 will also be enforced.

5) **GIVE**: We need you to continue to give. In this newsletter is a brief report on our stewardship during this pandemic, as well as a reminder of how you can continue to give during these times.

6) We are in **Phase Orange** currently, following the State of MN and the United Methodist Church Guidelines for our reopen plan. Starting Sept. 6th we shall enter the next phase—Yellow. If you would like

more details on these guidelines contact us and we will email the documentation

we are following. It will also be posted at the church for your viewing.

6) **Do no Harm; Do Good, Stay in Love with God** is the foundational principle we are following as United Methodists as we work toward re-opening. Why we are following such strict protocols and being overly cautious is that we do not want to harm anyone, we want to do good, and help each member and friend of BUMC stay in love with God. We ask for your understanding and cooperation as we move toward Re-Opening for Worship at BUMC.

Please hold BUMC and its leadership in your prayers as we work our way toward Sept. 6th.


White Fragility Why It's So Hard for White People to Talk about Racism



Are you still giving through BUMC?

Covid-19 has taken a terrible toll on churches, non-profits, restaurants, and other small businesses. BUMC is no exception. We have taken some steps, having canceled many of our maintenance contracts and as an example are mowing the lawn with volunteers (every other Thursday at 10am if you would like to join us.) Our Trustees have gone through the building and shut off anything not absolutely essential for our buildings (example: no air conditioning.) We kept our contract employees on full pay through May but have had to suspend them which was hard for us. We worked hard on a PPP loan from our bank and Federal Government that should be turned into a grant (for almost \$66,000). We weren't accepted for the 1st round of applications, then turned down by our bank for most of the asking for the 2nd application but we dug in, called a few people and got the majority of our request!

We have done almost everything humanly possible to cut expenses and keep our ministry alive. Our Church leadership went so far as creating a program that tracks our giving and our expenses that we review weekly and all our decisions are based on firm financial principles to keep our ministry alive.

But it all still comes down to your gifts. Many churches, many non-profits, are not going to survive this pandemic. Reality is that churches are going to be one of the last, if not last "businesses" allowed to re-open to their full capacity! But at BUMC we are not only going to survive this pandemic we are going to thrive. We are still going to be the heart of the Brooklyns, we are still going to love God and Neighbor, Heal a Broken World, Reach New People, and Be A Church for Everyone.

We have not closed, we will not close, we will thrive. But that takes you. Please continue to give through your church. And if possible, increase your gift or make a special gift during these Pandemic Times.

Have the last couple of months felt kind of like the world has been turned upside down? You read and hear about climate change, a scary virus, people have lost their jobs and need help with feeding their families, and the issues of racism and protests against it. Do you feel like you're too "little" or young to make a difference, to take action? There's a story about a farming community that was devastated by drought. First the crops died from lack of rain and now the town was dying. So they all gathered together in the town hall to pray for rain. But only one person brought an umbrella--a boy of 7. Now that is faith.

Find something that really gets you excited and find a way to get involved. Write a letter to the government about climate change. Have a front porch food drive in your neighborhood and collect the items and take them to CEAP or another food shelf. Join a peaceful protest at a high school or go to 38th and Chicago Avenue to show your support for an end to racism. Mow the lawn of a senior neighbor who is stuck in the house. Make and wear a mask to help keep people at risk from the Covid-19 virus a little safer. Write an encouraging message with sidewalk chalk so that someone can read it from their front steps.

Everyone can make a difference. Girls and boys, young or old, any color or ethnicity. Remember to pray for the change you'd like to see--and bring your umbrella.


