

Pastor's Word

A reporter asks a millennial: "What do you think of Christians following Jesus?" The Millennial: "I think that would be a good idea." Ouch! I don't know about you but as a Christian, I think we followers of Jesus have a perception problem. We are being perceived by young people especially, as not following Jesus. Right or wrong the perception is real and for those that hold it, it's reality. So maybe we followers of Jesus need to reclaim Jesus!

Who is Jesus? What did he say? Did he mean it? These are just a few of the questions I think we as need to ask ourselves if those outside our faith are going to perceive us as Christ-followers and be willing to give this Jesus Christ a try. Christ in Crisis is a worship and sermon series that Pastor Henry and I are going to take the Heart of the Brooklyns through for August, September and October. Each Sunday we will ask a question that Jesus asked or raised as he walked and lived among us. Each is a guestion from

Jesus we must ask now. Jesus expected a response, both then and now, and we will struggle with what should be our response in our time and place. In effect, we will be reclaiming Jesus leading up to our Fall election. In this highly charged and politically divided time we live in, we are going to ask each other not to go right, or go left, but go deeper into our faith. To take all of our division, all our politics out of our thinking, and replace it with a deep look at the questions Jesus asked of his followers and expected them to respond!

We are starting this series on August 9th, with a message from Pastor Henry introducing Christ in Crisis and getting us started on our journey on reclaiming Christ as the center of our lives. I ask on Sunday evening, August 9th, that you set some time aside for a household meal of **Soul Food**. Whatever type of food feeds your soul. For me rhubarb pie will be involved and something that has gravy poured over it. But on the 9th, sit your household down for a meal of food that feeds your soul. And then huddle up together at the end of the meal and bring up the theme of **Christ in Crisis: Why We Need to Reclaim Jesus**. Talk together about how we Christians have moved away from going deeper into what Jesus actually said and how we often do not respond to his call to action. Talk about the great national divide that is out there and what role Christians have played in that divide. Talk about Jesus of Nazareth, his teachings, his example, his Spirit, and the cultural complicity of much of contemporary Christianity. Consider Sunday evening the 9th as a **Soul Food Feast**, some good soul food and a good discussion about Jesus that will feed your soul and begin us on a journey toward, not right, or left, but deeper!

In addition to our Sunday morning messages, on Sunday evenings, August—October at 7pm Pastor Henry or I will hold a Zoom/Facebook Live faith@home study, talking about our message that morning and diving deeper into the Scripture text and Jesus's question,

inviting every household to explore deeper all week at home. Linda, Children's Ministries (Sundays at 6pm) and Mim, Youth Ministries, (Mondays at 8pm) will also be connecting by Zoom/Facebook Live with families and youth families respectively to ask our Jesus Question for the week as well.

We will also be asking every household of BUMC to carve out 10 minutes a day to huddle together with our Faith5, we are now calling it faith@home, each day exploring our Jesus Question for that week, going deeper in our renewal of Christ in our life. It all begins, Sunday, August 9th. Please join us for Christ in Crisis!



Trustee's Corner: We have been preparing for our target date, September 6th, for having in-house worship. There has been a lot of work done and much left to do to meet the state's guidelines for reopening. The goal is to make



things safe for your return. In addition to all of the items like safe distance and masks, we will be upgrading our heating and air conditioning filters. Air quality is a concern when having larger numbers of people in an enclosed space. We have agreed air purification is necessary. The equipment will be installed in the ductwork. The system comes with a cost, but our safety is the first concern.

Change has come to our Trash and Recycling area. For the volunteers who come around and clean you will find the bin areas are now locked. Keys to gain access are available Monday through Friday at the West African Food Shelf desk. This was a difficult decision, but the misuse of both bins has made it necessary. On several occasions there has been furniture and mattresses put in the trash container. The trash hauler is charged for these items by the landfill and the extra cost is passed on to us. The leadership team is doing everything possible to keep expenses down day to day and especially during this pandemic time.

Cutting Edge Crew: I would just like to take a moment to thank one of our members who has graciously provided money for us

Are you still giving through BUMC?

Covid-19 has taken a terrible toll on churches, non-profits, restaurants, and other small businesses. BUMC is no exception. We have taken some steps, having canceled many of our maintenance contracts and as an example are mowing the lawn with volunteers (every other Thursday at 10am if you would like to join us.) Our Trustees have gone through the building and shut off anything not absolutely essential for our buildings (example: no air conditioning.) We kept our contract employees on full pay through May but have had to suspend them which was hard for us. We worked hard on a PPP loan from our bank and Federal Government that should be turned into a grant (for almost \$66,000). We weren't accepted for the 1st round of applications, then turned down by our bank for most of the asking for the 2nd application but we dug in, called a few people and got the majority of our request!

We have done almost everything humanly possible to cut expenses and keep our ministry alive. Our Church leadership went so far as creating a program that tracks our giving and our expenses that we review weekly and all our decisions are based on firm financial principles to keep our ministry alive.

But it all still comes down to your gifts. Many churches, many non-profits, are not going to survive this pandemic. Reality is that churches are going to be one of the last, if not last "businesses" allowed to re-open to their full capacity! But at BUMC we are not only going to survive this pandemic we are going to thrive. We are still going to be the heart of the Brooklyns, we are still going to love God and Neighbor, Heal a Broken World, Reach New People, and Be A Church for Everyone.

We have not closed, we will not close, we will thrive. But that takes you. Please continue to give through your church. And if possible, increase your gift or make a special gift during these Pandemic Times.

Earlier this month, I successfully completed a *graduate certificate in Non-profit church leadership.* A year ago, I enrolled at the above program at Dakota Wesleyan University. The idea for the certificate program came from the leadership and planning team for the \$1 million Lilly Grant that the Dakotas-Minnesota Area received in 2016. The grant helped underwrite the cost of the certificate program for participants, although clergy and their churches are also funding a portion of

I am grateful to God for the opportunity provided by the Minnesota Annual Conference and Brooklyn United Methodist Church. It was a practical and effective learning experience. In a nutshell, the program provides participants with the business acumen required to meet the demands of a growing church, along with training in how to handle aspects of fundraising, organizational leadership, and human resources. The program is 21 graduate credits, delivered in 8 courses that emphasize stewardship of all resources—money, people. talent, and vision. It is designed to strengthen competencies that pastors need to lead effectively in today's world but did not necessarily obtain during their undergraduate, graduate, or seminary education.

Financial Peace University

Most of our BUMC leaders completed 9 weeks of Dave Ramsey's Financial Peace University. Faith Every Night, In Every Home, Reinforced Every Week in Church!

Covid-19 has changed us, it has changed our lives, it has changed how we can be church. Going back to "normal" is something that is not going to happen. How we live our lives, how we do church, all things have changed and we need to discover new ways to do important things, like Christian Education and faith formation. How do we teach the faith in a post Covid-19 world? We do not know when we will be able to gather again and have "Sunday School" but we are still entrusted with teaching the faith. So at BUMC we are shifting our focus into making the home the primary teacher of the faith, and the church, will reinforce every home in this most important task of teaching the faith to every generation.

What we ask is that your household, your home, one person or 6, full of kids, a teenager or two, or an empty nesters, or a community of neighbors from across the hall, whatever your home looks like to take 10 minutes a day with our Faith5. Can you find 10 minutes a day, everyday, to grow your faith?

Sunday, Sept. 6th

Our Trustees, Leadership Team and Staff are working hard to prepare for our return to in-person, on-site worship for Sunday, September 6th. There is a great deal that is going into this effort. Our Trustees are looking into cleaning, social distancing, mask requirement, air filtration, moving people in and out safely, occupancy limits and even registration so we can control the number of people who attend each service as just a sample of what needs to be done before the 6th.

We ask that you do two things for us as we prepare for on-site, indoor worship to resume. 1) Return the survey that is again included in this newsletter or check the weekly announcements to do online. It will help us plan and help us provide a safe environment for us to worship. 2) Understand that Sept. 6th is a target date. It may change. One of our Three Simple Rules of Methodism is to do no harm! If our leadership determines that we would be doing harm to return to in-person on-site worship then we shall delay our planning until we can safely say that worshipping together will do no harm.

We would also ask that if you feel unsafe returning in person, that you <u>do not</u> return and continue to worship with us virtually or by our phone service (877-447-2862). Know also that our drive-up option, worshipping in your car in our parking lot will continue and is an option for you. But if you are going to stay home please let us know by returning the survey. It will just help us in our planning.

One last thing, our leadership will constantly be updating our safety protocols once worship has an on-site, in-person option again, and at any time, worship will be shut down. Our online, drive-up, and phone service will continue into the future as options for you to worship with the Heart of the Brooklyns.

Faith₅ for Families: Building f@ith@home Everyday


Brooklyn's Kids Time on Sundays and Wednesdays will look different very soon.

Wednesdays, starting August 5th, families will be invited to join Linda for about 10 minutes in using the Faith5 process to help build families that look forward to communicating better, sharing everyday, and feeling closer, while laying the foundations of lasting faith in their children. On Sundays beginning August 9th we will take the Sunday scripture and message and work it through Faith5 together for a deeper experience that takes about 20 minutes.

Many of our kids are used to Faith5 from church school and are used to sharing their highs and lows, relating it to scripture or a Bible story, and praying for the group. I'm excited to be able to do this again with kids and their families.

Please join us every Wednesday and Sunday at 6 PM. Wednesdays will be posted on our Facebook pages and Sundays will be on Zoom for those who want to actively participate and on Facebook Live for those that want to watch and listen.

Our goal is faith formation once a week in church and everyday in the home!







Grab Gather Grow is changing to...faith@home

Each week Pastor Rich produces what was called Grab Gather Grow to help us all grow deeper in our faith and dive into our weekly scripture lesson a litter further. Starting August 9th Grab Gather Grow is being transformed into faith@home. It will still be a weekly opportunity for you to dive deeper into scripture and discipleship. Pastor Rich or Pastor Henry will be going live each week on Zoom and Facebook with the weekly study, but it will be moved to Sunday evenings at 7pm. It will still focus around our weekly theme and scripture lesson. The change, hence the name change, will be that it will focus more on the Faith5 that our families of elementary aged children are practicing every day at home. It will still be written for homes that do not have elementary aged children but will sync up with what our children and their families are learning as well. It will walk us through the Faith5 (Share, Read, Talk, Pray, Bless) as well as give us some service options for our home and for the church as a whole.

What we ask is you start to make faith@home part of your weekly routine by attending worship weekly, virtually or through drive-up/outdoor worship, then on Sunday evening at 7pm or any time during the week on your own, gather your household or a small gathering of people together, and walk through faith@home. Then once a day, use the Faith5 text for the day and spend 10 minutes sharing, reading, talking, praying and blessing your way through the

week as a home of faith.

Covid-19 has changed how we can even do church, but it cannot be allowed to take away our faith development. Faith@home is our attempt to continue to support your growth in faith and to make us all better followers of Jesus Christ. Each week we will introduce our weekly theme and scripture during our worship experiences. Then we ask you continue to learn at home through faith@home once a week spending about a half hour going deeper into our scripture theme and then daily spending 10 minutes with our Faith5. We pray you will make faith@home part of your home's faith routine.

Join us Sunday Evenings, 7pm by Zoom/Facebook Live

Starting Sunday, **August 9th** at **7pm** we invite you to join us by Zoom or Facebook Live for a time to go deeper! Our pastors will be leading a study of the weeks Jesus' Question from their morning message by exploring the Bible story deeper than they can in their morning message. This will be a great way to start out your week exploring our worship theme.

Zoom will be the best for people who want to interact and be part of the discussion in real time. Facebook Live for those who want to just wave and listen in. During these Covid-19 days the f@ith@home Studies on Sunday evenings, 7pm will be a great way for your faith to ao deeper.

Mark you calendars now and make the time for f@ith@home. Families with children, join Linda at 6pm for a f@ith@home experience built around families with children.


