The other day I was online and heard Dr. Michael Osterholm, the director of the Center for Infectious Disease Research and Policy at the University of Minnesota, state that "the next 6 to 12 weeks are going to be the darkest of the entire pandemic." I have to be honest, my heart sank a little. It was snowing out as I read the article quoting Dr. Osterholm. I was also being the online support staff for my two kids going through distance learning. I was having some technical issues with getting my sermon posted and for some reason, our church's phone service was not allowing me to upload my message. I'm trying to keep the house up while my wife is full-time teaching onsite and finishing up her Master's degree as a full-time student. My dad was put into the hospital (pancreatitis) for a few days and no one from the family can even go up and visit him. Plus our family has decided to not gather at all for Thanksgiving or Christmas this year. Needless to say, when I watched them read Dr. Osterholm's comments about the pandemic I was feeling sorry for myself and more than a little tired of this Pandemic. But, then I began to realize that I still have so much to be thankful for! I have a roof over my head and food in my pantry, my kids are safe and their teachers are doing their best to educate them. Though I can not see my dad in the hospital I can call him and talk with him, and I get to spend a lot of time with my family these days. And the church... the church is still a church, my faith is still able to grow, and I am still able to love God and Neighbor as I am the Heart of the Brooklyns. Everyone, even though we are about to go through some of the darkest weeks of this pandemic I encourage you to do the following:

*Wear a Mask *Be socially distant *Wash your hands *Get a flu shot *Stay at home as much as possible *Clean the surfaces around you often *Get some fresh air *Be the Heart of the Brooklyns within your Covid circle *Worship: Digitally or through our phone service is best, in-person if you are healthy and have not been in contact with anyone who has been exposed to Covid-19.

*Give a portion of what God has made possible to the ministry of BUMC *Limit your in-person contacts as much as possible *Make two phone calls a day with someone from BUMC *Talk with distant family members once a day *Shut off the news when it is stressing you out and read some scripture instead * Practice our Faith5 every day—share, read, talk, pray and bless your way each day


* Pray our new Breakthrough Prayer daily *Check on a neighbor * Deliver a food pantry box to a neighbor if needed
